

AMTRAK EXHIBIT TRAIN COMING TO MEMPHIS OCTOBER 4, 2014



In celebration of Memphis Central Station's 100th anniversary, Amtrak has announced that the Amtrak Exhibit Train will come to town on Saturday, October 4th. Originally created to celebrate Amtrak's 40th anniversary in 2011, the train consists of a locomotive and three display cars painted in a historic paint scheme. Inside the cars are displays portraying events and achievements during the first forty years of Amtrak. In the last car of the train, a reconfigured Amfleet Cafe' Car, a gift shop offers for sale many items for sale as mementos of the trains visit.

The celebration of Central Station's anniversary are in the early stages, but in addition to the Amtrak Exhibit Train it is anticipated that equipment of Memphis' railroads will also be on display.

Tom Parker was elected Vice President.



Projects on the Drawing Board

The museum has several projects on the drawing board which are hoped to be completed in the near future.

Another project underway is the "Memphis Railroad Family Tree", a graphical representation of the history of each railroad serving Memphis. Measuring 16' X 6", it will be mounted on the wall above the Bridge Mural on the south wall of the museum.

A third initiative underway is installation of an "O" gauge dual loop track on the wall of the party room. Trains featuring cars from the various historical Memphis railroads will circle the room at a height of about seven feet above the floor.
